### The Annual Work Program Promotes:

- Advancement of Major Projects Consistent w/Agency's Capabilities
- Continuous Learning
- Innovative Regional Solutions
- Organizational Effectiveness
- Regional and National Leadership





- Continue development of a regional housing affordability strategy and coalition to influence implementation.
- Continue implementation of CATLYST, the region's economic competitiveness strategy.
- Implement redesigned Community Development Assistance Program, including redesigned LCI.
- Implement enhanced Aging & Independence Services programs, including new behavioral health coaching partnership with area housing authorities.





- Continue and expand the ConnectATL program in partnership with GDOT and other potential partners.
- Update of the Region's Arts and Culture Plan.
- Work with Metro Chamber, United Way, Community Foundation, Career Rise and others, to explore more collaboration in the region's workforce system.
- Complete major update of Atlanta Region's Plan, including Regional Transportation Plan, Community Development Plan, and incorporating aging, workforce, natural resource and homeland security elements.





- Continue UASI work in support of the 2019 Super Bowl and the 2020 NCAA Final Four events.
- Continue implementation of What's Next ATL platform.
- Continue several transit-related projects and activities:
  - DeKalb Transit Master Plan Study
  - Incorporate More MARTA program and Douglas Transit System into RTP
  - Incorporation of Gwinnett Transit Plan into RTP
  - Coordinating with the start-up of the ATL.





- Continue development of the "Finding the Flint" program.
- Implement recommendations of Compensation & Classification study.
- Complete Board Engagement Task Force work and implement recommendations adopted by the Board.
- Evaluate indirect costs, including pension program.
- Update succession planning assessment.
- Continue ARC 2.0 evaluation and implementation.










## Expenditure by Category 2019 \$86,473,527
