## Livable Centers Initiative (LCI) Program

- Encourages local governments to plan and implement strategies that link transportation improvements with development
- Program links implementation actions to receipt of transportation project funding
- Takes advantage of existing infrastructure in centers & corridors



# LCI Authorization & Funding

- Funding provided in Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and programmed in Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)
- Use Federal Transportation Program Funds
- \$2.25 Million per year for Studies (New for 2019)
- \$500 million for transportation projects to 2040.






## Since 1999, LCI has awarded:

- \$8.6 million to 119 communities for catalytic studies,
- \$5.6 million for 118 supplemental/tactical studies
- \$216 million for 137 LCI transportation projects in 69 communities


