# Election Results – Federal / National

- Federal Big Picture
  - Democrats flip U.S. House of Representatives
    - Rep. Nancy Pelosi expected to win Speaker of the House vote in January
    - 234-201\*(CA-21, NC-09)
  - Republicans hold and increase majority in the U.S. Senate
    - 53-47

- Federal Georgia Delegation
  - One seat gain by Democrats Georgia's 6<sup>th</sup> Congressional District (9–5)
  - Rep-Elect Lucy McBath (D-06)
    - Gun Control Advocate
    - Healthcare Costs
    - Infrastructure

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### **Election Results – State**

- Governor
  - Secretary of State Brian Kemp (R) defeated former House Minority Leader Stacey Abrams (D)
- Lieutenant Governor
  - Rep. Geoff Duncan (R) defeated challenger Sarah Riggs Amico (D)
- State Senate
  - Democrats picked up 2 Metro Atlanta seats
  - Republicans enjoy a 35 21 majority
- State House of Representatives
  - Democrats picked up 11 Metro Atlanta seats
  - Republicans enjoy a 105 75 majority



## Election Results – State (Other results of note)

- Rep. Brad Raffensperger (R) defeated former Congressman John Barrow (D) for Secretary of State in 12/4 runoff
- Republican incumbent Chuck Eaton defeated Democrat Lindy Miller for the Public Service Commission District 3 seat in 12/4 runoff
- Also of note:
  - Rep. John Meadows (R-05, Calhoun) passed just prior to Special Session; special election scheduled for January 8th
  - Rep. Jason Shaw (R-176, Lakeland) will replace outgoing PSC Commissioner Doug Everett; special election date TBD.

# H.B. 930

- H.B. 930 created the Atlanta-Region Transit Link Authority
- Oversees governance, funding and transit planning across a 13-county region across the Metro-Atlanta region

• MARTA

- Passed with overwhelming majorities in both chambers
- ATL Board comprised of 16 members
  - 5 State Appointees
  - 10 elected "Transit District Representatives"
  - 1 Ex-Officio (GDOT Commissioner)

## **State Appointees**

- Gubernatorial Appointee for ATL Chair
  - Charlie Sutlive Director of Corporate Communications, Georgia Power Co.
- Lieutenant Governor Appointees (2)
  - Mark Toro Managing Partner, North American Properties
  - Teddy Russell Co-owner & President of Russell Landscape
- Speaker of the House Appointees (2)
  - Charlotte Nash Chair of the Gwinnett County Commission
  - Rep. Earl Ehrhart appointment effective pending departure from Legislature (Jan)

# Elected "Transit District Representatives"

- 10 Representatives elected by a caucus of Legislative Delegation members, County Commissioners and Mayors between October and November
- Districts defined by population parity and high volume transportation corridors

  - Regional Commissions
- Go! Transit Capital Program
- H.B. 930
- Motor-Fuel Tax Exemption



# **Aging Services**

- Funding for Home & Community Based Services
  - Home and community based services are vital to prolonging independent living for Georgia seniors
  - Cost-savings arguments
- Aging & Disability Resource Connection (ADRC)
  - Telephone and other technology-based consulting options for connecting people to services
  - Replacement funding based on FY 17-18 federal reductions
  - Currently receive \$37,000 per year from state



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# Workforce Development

- Workforce Board Meeting Options
  - H.B. 810 failed in 2018
  - Would have brought Georgia code in line with federal code by allowing for Board meetings to be held by teleconference
