Introduction

In August 2020, the **A.L. Burruss Institute of Public Service and Research** at **Kennesaw State University** conducted the “Metro Atlanta Speaks” survey on behalf of the **Atlanta Regional Commission** (ARC). A total of 4,404 adult residents across ten counties in the metro area were included in the 2020 survey¹. The survey incorporated both landline and cellphone telephone samples and, for 2020, online surveys were included as part of the overall survey strategy. The online panel consisted of a total of 1,889 respondents across the ten counties, accounting for almost 43% of the entire sample. The remaining respondents were evenly divided between cellphone and landline samples (see *Table 1*).

A total of four hundred (400) completions were targeted in eight of the ten counties. Respondents in DeKalb and Fulton counties were oversampled in order to obtain a separate sample of 400 residents of the City of Atlanta. The final respondent total for DeKalb County was 531 (131 in the city of Atlanta), while the final respondent total for Fulton County was 671 (269 in the city of Atlanta).

¹ Included in the survey were the 10 counties in the ARC’s service region: Cherokee, Clayton, Cobb, DeKalb, Douglas, Fayette, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry and Rockdale counties.

Thus, a subset of Atlanta residents is available for separate analysis. Analyses of the metro-wide data, as well as the individual results for Fulton and DeKalb counties, treat Atlanta residents as members of their respective counties. The results for the City of Atlanta included in the accompanying tables are based on a separate analysis of the subset of respondents from those two counties.

The results for the 8 counties with 400 completed surveys (all but DeKalb and Fulton), as well as those for the city of Atlanta, have margins of error (MOE) within each of those entities of $\pm 5\%$. For DeKalb County, the MOE is $\pm 4.3\%$; in Fulton the MOE is ± 3.8 . For the metro region as a whole, the MOE is $\pm 1.5\%$.

Within each individual county, the data was weighted to reflect a county's adult population distribution on gender, age, race, education and whether or not the respondent is Hispanic or Latino. After the data for all of the counties were weighted for these factors, the data was combined and then weighted to reflect the relative distribution of the population across the 10 counties. For the separate analyses of city of Atlanta residents, the respondents were weighted for the same characteristics as the individual counties with an additional weighting factor to reflect the City of Atlanta's relative population distribution across DeKalb and Fulton counties.

Comparison of Demographic Characteristics of Online and Telephone Respondents

The ARC has sponsored the Metro Atlanta Speaks Survey every year since 2013. The inclusion of an online component in the survey is new to 2020. It is useful to examine the demographic differences between the online and telephone sample respondents.

Table 2 provides a summary of these comparisons on key demographic characteristics. An examination of these differences leads to the following conclusions:

- The inclusion of an online panel component resulted in improved participation of respondents in each of the three youngest age groups; the improvement was particularly noticeable among the 18-24 and 25-34 age ranges. This improvement reflects the decreased representation of seniors (65+) in the online sample compared to the telephone component (23.6% to 40%, respectfully).
- The inclusion of a higher percentage of younger respondents in the online sample is reflected in the higher percentage of the online sample who are employed either full-time or part-time.
- Lower income respondents were represented at slightly higher levels among online respondents. It should be noted that the percentage of respondents who refused to provide an answer to this question was more than 50% lower among online respondents compared to telephone respondents (7.6% to 16.4%, respectively).

- While representation of Latino/Latina respondents was slightly higher among online respondents, representation among African-American respondents was slightly lower in the online sample when compared to the telephone respondents.
- The bias in favor of female respondents historically reflected in telephone surveys was even more pronounced in the online sample (55.6% and 61.8%, respectively).
- The online sample did not improve access to less educated respondents. The distribution of educational attainment was virtually the same across the two groups.

Weighted frequency distributions for each substantive question and the demographic characteristics of the metro-wide sample are provided below. These are followed by a series of tables comparing the responses to each substantive question by the various demographic subgroups.

In regards to the comparison of demographic subgroups, ***most of the results are statistically significant at the .01 level. Results in normal black text meet this level of statistical significance.*** Results expressed in **green text** are statistically significant at a level between .01 and .05, while results in **red text** do not meet the .05 minimum threshold for statistical significance. Statistical significance simply indicates the probability that observed differences between subgroups on any given question are a function of chance rather than some real relationship between the two variables. Observed differences that are significant at the .05 level means that there is only a 5% probability that the observed differences are a function of random chance. A .01 significance level means that there is only a 1% probability of the observed differences being a function of chance.
