Purpose of Amendment 7

- Financial and schedule changes to close out FY 2023
- GDOT Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) rebalancing
- Cost changes to Major Mobility Investment Program (MMIP)

General cost estimate increases to other federal-aid projects beyond the threshold for an administrative modification




- Projects located in the Cobb, Clayton, Fulton, Gwinnett and Henry Counties

Amendment 7 Financial Summary

- Amendment 7 proposes the following programming changes for 11 projects:
- Federal and state funding increase of \$126 million
 - Additional \$110 million in federal funding
 - \$48 million from ARC sources programming authority sources
 - \$62 million from GDOT programming authority sources
 - Additional \$16 million in state funding
- Local funding offset (decreased) by \$26 million





TIP/MTP Amendment 7 Major Milestones

- Project list compilation and partner coordination January through February
- 30-day Public Comment period March 16 through April 25
 - Extended from April 14 to April 25
 - Public Hearing Friday, April 7 (TCC meeting)
- Proposed committee and board action
 - ARC TCC May 5
 - ARC TAQC May 10
 - ARC Board May 10
 - GRTA Board May 16
- Submit documentation to US DOT (FHWA & FTA) and US EPA for approval May 16
- Conformity Determination expected by early June 2023
