Current Tier 1 NOFOs

- Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods (RCN) Program
 - \$3.35 billion available
 - \$450 million reserved for Regional Partnerships Challenge grants
 - Applications due September 28
 - In previous funding cycle, the region (City of Roswell, City of Atlanta) received 1.59% of total available nationwide
- Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) Grants
 - \$50 million available for planning and prototyping only
 - \$250,000 minimum / \$2,000,000 maximum
 - Applications due October 10
 - In previous funding cycle, the region (Gwinnett County) received 1.12% of total available nationwide





Current Tier 2 NOFOs

- Pilot Program for Transit Oriented Development
 - \$13.5 million available
 - Applications due October 10
 - The region received no funding in the last cycle
- Nationally Significant Federal Lands and Tribal Projects
 - \$88.3 million available
 - Applications due November 6
 - The region received no funding in the last cycle

- Bridge Investment Program
- Railroad Crossing Elimination Program
- Advanced Transportation Technologies and Innovation Mobility Deployment Program (ATTIMD) / Advanced Transportation Technology and Innovation Program (ATTAIN)
- Local and Regional Project Assistance Grants (RAISE)





Pending Tier 2 NOFOs (3rd and 4th quarter 2023)

- Rail Vehicle Replacement Grants
- Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvement (CRISI) Grants
- Federal-State Partnership for Intercity Passenger Rail Grants
- Airport Terminal Program
- Grid Resilience and Partnerships (GRIP) Program



Atlanta Beltline to Flint River Trail

- The region has benefited enormously from the world's busiest airport, but at the expense of neighboring communities which have lost land and population
- The airport and supporting freeway network divide and burden the area with noise pollution, air pollution and stormwater flooding
- \$100M+ request under Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods program for planning, design, NEPA, engineering and construction
- Leverages multiple existing plans and trail projects to provide a continuous corridor across freeways and around the airport
- 10+ partner and stakeholder agencies
