Amendment Review and Action Responsibilities

- Review and action of amendments to the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) require involvement of the MPO technical committee (TCC) and policy committee (TAQC).
 - Projects in the regional transportation plan must meet regional goals and be fiscally constrained
 - Projects included in an amendment project lists fit within established criteria that do not qualify as an eligible change for a quarterly administrative modification
 - MPO committees responsible for reviewing and taking action on projects of regional significance listed in amendment list
 - Potential air quality impacts
 - Financial impacts
 - Overall regional impacts







What Triggers an **Amendment to the** MTP and TIP?

Advancement of a federal funded phase from Long Range to TIP period (or vice versa)

Increasing the cost of existing project phases in excess of \$4 million or 40% more than current total phase cost

Adding a new federal-funded project to the TIP

Why is Amendment 4 Required?

- Advancement of a federal funded phase from Long Range to TIP period (or vice versa)
- Increasing the cost of existing project phases in excess of \$4 million or 40% more than current total phase cost
 - Adding a new federal-funded project to the TIP

- Advancing project phases from federal recognized Long Range years to TIP years (between FY 2024-2027)
- General cost estimate increases to federal-aid projects beyond the threshold for an administrative modification
- Program remaining fund award projects from the 2024 TIP Solicitation
- Add new projects exempt from air quality conformity analysis





Project Summary

- Cost Estimate Increases
 - I-75 Commercial Vehicle Lanes from I-475 to SR 20
 - SR 20 (Cumming Highway/Knox Bridge Highway) Widening from I-75 to I-575
 - Upper Riverdale Road Bridge Upgrade at Flint River
 - I-85 North Interchange Improvements from SR 42 to SR 155
- New Exempt Projects
 - ARC 2024 TIP Solicitation
 - Peachtree Safe Street Midtown (City of Atlanta/Midtown Alliance)
 - Marietta Boulevard Safe Street (City of Atlanta)
 - Recreational Trails
 - Rivers Edge Trail Extension (Clayton County)
 - Chattahoochee Riverlands Recreational Trail and Riverview Trailhead (City of Smyrna)
 - Wheel Beautiful Riverlands Scenic Universal Access Trail (City of Chattahoochee Hills)
 - Transportation Alternatives Program Statewide Sub-Allocation
 - Flowers Road Multi-Use Path from School Drive to Van Fleet Circle (City of Doraville)






Amendment 4 Financial Impact

- 25 Projects Total
- \$207 million total increase
 - Federal additional \$123 million
 - State additional \$19 million
 - Local additional \$66 million
- By Project Type
 - Roadway \$86 million federal share increase
 - Last Mile Connectivity \$25 million federal share increase
 - Transit \$25 million federal share increase
 - Other \$4 million federal share increase
