What is the UPWP?

- One of the four core federally required planning documents for an MPO (MTP, TIP, and Participation Plan are the others)
- Developed annually in conjunction with agencywide budget and work program
- Identifies metropolitan transportation planning activities performed with federal, state and local funds in the MPO area
- Developed in cooperation with the State, local governments, and public transportation operators

Changes Resulting from Comment Period

- Informal comment period ran from October 1-31
- No comments were received from the general public
- ARC adjusted budgets for several TPD cost centers to align with shifts made in agency budget and work program (no overall change in federal PL/5303 funding)
- ♣ EPD pointed out a typo and requested a revision to the description of an EPA funded work activity in Appendix 4
- GDOT identified a disconnect in data between Appendices 1 and 3 for one work activity (no overall change in federal PL/5303 funding); noted that new FY 2027-2030 TIP was missing from list of 2026 highlights



Changes Resulting from Comment Period

USDOT

- Additional discussion of relationship of Atlanta MPO process and Winder Urbanized Area
- Additional justification of eligibility of work activities led by other departments and alignment with current federal priorities and directives
- Like GDOT, noted the omission of the FY 2027-2030 TIP from the list of 2026 highlights
- Suggested other work activities to include in the list of 2026 highlights
- Removal of work activities led by other departments which are funded from formula programs and included in the TIP
- Removal of references to federal emphasis areas
- Other wordsmithing and clarifications throughout the document







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
