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MTP Orientation

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What is an MTP?

▀ A Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) is a long-range multimodal transportation plan required to be fiscally constrained and updated every 4 years.



Sets a **vision** for the MPO's future multimodal network



Creates an **action plan** by identifying needs and recommending operational improvements



Guides long-term **regional investments**

MTP Federal Requirements

📊 Federal Approval Deadline

- The MTP must be federally approved no later than **February 2028**

📊 Federal Planning Factors

- The plan must support **federal transportation planning factors**

📊 Financial Constraint

- Projects must be supported by **reasonably expected revenues**

📊 Federal Funding Eligibility

- Projects must be included in a conforming MTP to be eligible for federal funding
- All projects in the TIP **must be included in, or consistent with**, the MTP
