ARC Board Adopts Amendment to Transportation Improvement Program

Upon recommendation from the Transportation & Air Quality Committee, the Board unanimously approved Amendment #5 to the 2018-2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), which included some \$400 million in new projects requested by cities and counties around the region during the 2017 project solicitation.

This amendment required a 30-day public comment period that ended during the June 14 TAQC meeting and addressed cost and programmatic changes, as well as changes to the travel demand model coding. Prior to the June 27 meeting, the Board heard public comment from three Douglas County citizens asking members not to approve the amendment due to perceived improprieties during the local project approval process for a new Douglas County bus service.

ARC Working to Make Streets Safer for Walking & Bicycling

John Orr, Transportation & Access Group Manager, provided the ARC board with a first read of a regional action plan for reducing traffic fatalities in metropolitan Atlanta called Safe Streets for Walking & Bicycling. The plan is part of the recently adopted Walk. Bike. Thrive! bicycle and pedestrian vision. Based on newly-released federal guidelines for bike/pedestrian safety, and almost two years of research by ARC staff, the plan sets a goal of zero bike/ped fatalities in the Atlanta region by the year 2030.

Board members were reminded that when they adopted Walk. Bike. Thrive! in 2017, they instructed staff to "conduct investigations into the causes and location of fatalities and injuries within the Atlanta region, and recommend an appropriate course of action for the Agency to follow in improving safety outcomes on our transportation system for all users."

ARC Board Adopts Findings of Atlanta Regional Truck Parking Assessment Study as Policy

After a brief refresher of the study's findings from Transportation & Access group manager John Orr, the Board unanimously adopted the study as a policy guide for addressing truck parking challenges in the region with the understanding that ARC staff will use the study's findings as input into the future

development of local development and transportation plans and will provide technical assistance to local jurisdictions related to truck parking.

The Board had seen a more detailed report on the study at its March meeting and was voting on the study's adoption based on an affirmative vote from the Transportation & Air Quality Committee on June 14.

ARC Board Approves Resolution to Fight Hunger Among Older Individuals

Clark Boddie presented a resolution to support the state Department of Human Services' plan to develop a regional coalition to address senior hunger. As the Area Agency on Aging, the ARC is charged with the development of a Regional Senior Hunger Coalition. The board approved a resolution to enter a written contract with the Georgia Department of Human Services to develop and implement a Regional Senior Hunger Coalition.

Resources Needed to Carry out 2020 Census

Thurmond Tillman of the U.S. Census Bureau briefed board members on community needs as the 2020 Census approaches. As a critical undertaking that takes place every 10 years, the Census requires resources including employees, Complete Count Committees made up of community leaders, and space at the county-level to carry out the census. 2020 is the first year that the U.S. Census will be carried out online. Starting September 2018, hiring will begin for positions at the U.S. Census.
