

- Develop tailored, localized tools and products to support plan implementation

#### Key Freight Considerations


- → Increasing congestion on Georgia's intermodal freight network














Industrial Properties Built from 2016 - 2022




Industrial Properties Built from 2016 – 2022 + Under Construction and Proposed developments + Existing "Generators"

Industrial Properties Built from 2016 – 2022 + Under Construction and Proposed developments + Existing and Proposed "Generators"








Top CoStar Submarkets by Industrial Inventory (SF)




Top CoStar Submarkets by Industrial Under Construction (SF)




Top CoStar Submarkets by Vacancy (%)


