










Major Trends – Extreme Heat Events are Increasing


Projected days above 100°F

Projected days above 100°F





Major Trends – More Funding for Climate Action

- Dept of Energy: \$15B towards Clean Energy
- Dept of Interior: \$18B towards Community Resilience
- >\$9B towards economic revitalization and job creation in energy communities
- EPA: \$4.6B specifically for Climate Pollution Reduction Grant program
- EV Charging Infrastructure: \$1.4B to build out network
- ♣ EPA: \$1.45B to bolster Equity and Environmental Justice
- EPA: \$4B for water infrastructure programs
- DOT: \$198M for Reconnecting Communities Pilot Program

- Regional Local Government Clean Electricity Plan [DOE, ARC] (2024-2025)

\$3NI Secured Funding

- Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Grant (DOT)
- PROTECT Grant (FHWA)
- Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods (DOT)
