ARC also develops the short-range plan, the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), which covers the first four years of the MTP. This hearing is for the 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), which ARC is required to update, and the fiscal year 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program. The dates for public comment are Oct. 27 – Dec. 8. A virtual meeting will also be held Nov. 15, where updates will be shared, and attendees can make public comment at that time.

Unified Planning Work Program (TAQC Action; ARC Board Action)

The ARC Board and TAQC adopted the 2024 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), which documents metropolitan transportation planning activities performed with federal, state, and local transportation funds in the 20-county Atlanta metropolitan transportation planning area.

Metropolitan River Protection Act (MRPA) Corridor Plan Amendment Update (ARC Board Action)

The ARC Board adopted a resolution to amend the Chattahoochee Corridor Plan, which is administered by ARC and affected local governments under MRPA. The amendments are to allow public trails in the 500-foot buffer, to allow streambank restoration, and to allow removal of invasive species with subsequent revegetation with native species, and to exempt water supply reservoir dams from the 25-foot height limit in the river floodplains.

Nominations/Declarations & Election of ARC Chair

The ARC Board elected Atlanta Mayor Andre Dickens as the next ARC Board Chairman. His two-year term begins January 1, 2024. Dickens was the sole nominee for the position.

Metro Atlanta Speaks (MAS) (ARC Board Discussion/Information Item)

Nicole Hendrickson, Chair, CRC and Mike Carnathan, Senior Manager, Research & Analytics provided an overview of the 10th year of the 2023 Metro Atlanta Speaks survey. Highlighted were the new questions about housing affordability, electric vehicles, and climate change. MAS is the largest and most robust survey of its kind in the Atlanta region to glean perceptions of life and is the biggest data set we get to play with. For most of the years in the twenty - teens, transportation was the top issue. Now it's crime and the economy; yet where crime is concerned, there is a disconnect on how we think about crime at large versus in our neighborhoods. There is a lot of skepticism about expanding transit. In the area of housing affordability, about half of the respondents exhibit some form of financial distress and 30% of residents are struggling.

UASI Full-Scale Training Exercise(ARC Board Discussion/Information Item)

Jeff Turner, Chair, UASI and Bernard Coxton, Director, Homeland Security & Emergency Preparedness gave a presentation of the region's first multi-jurisdictional and multi-agency public safety full-scale training exercise in nearly ten years, which was conducted on Oct. 19.

The event was a huge success. Planning took more than 19 months. Coming together as the public





safety community to conduct these exercises is a plus for our region. The exercise involved more than 600 people, took place at two different locations, and occurred over 12 hours. It was the largest industrial exercise in the south. Bringing stakeholders together now to get to know one another makes it easier to work together in the future.
