What is the Area Plan on Aging?

- The Area Plan is the four-year plan created by Georgia's State Unit on Aging (Division of Aging Services in Department of Human Services).
 - Required by the federal Older Americans Act.
 - Statewide goals, objectives and measures to meet needs of individuals 60+.
 - Each area agency on aging (AAA), like ARC, develops strategies.
 - Serves as a grant application for upcoming year
- We are requesting your approval of:
 - An update: Year 2 of 4 of FY 21-24 Area Plan on Aging
 - Authorizes application for additional funding (e.g., federal COVID relief) that may become available



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5 Goals

- GOAL 1** - Provide long-term services and supports in homes and communities
- GOAL 2** - Ensure access to information
- GOAL 3** - Strengthen the aging network
- GOAL 4** - Prevent abuse, neglect, and exploitation
- GOAL 5** - Improve quality in provision of long-term services and supports

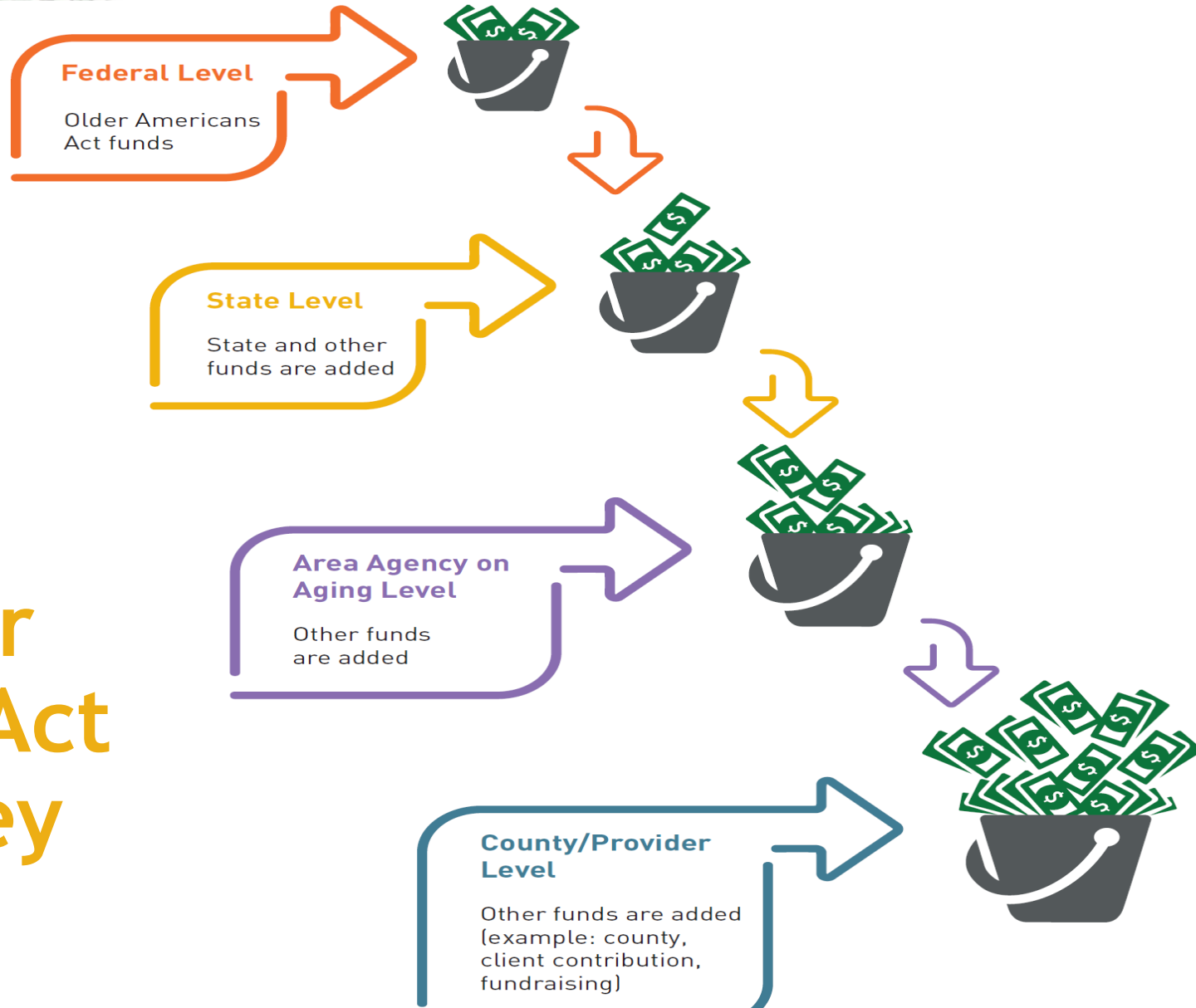

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FY 2021/FY 2022 Comparison

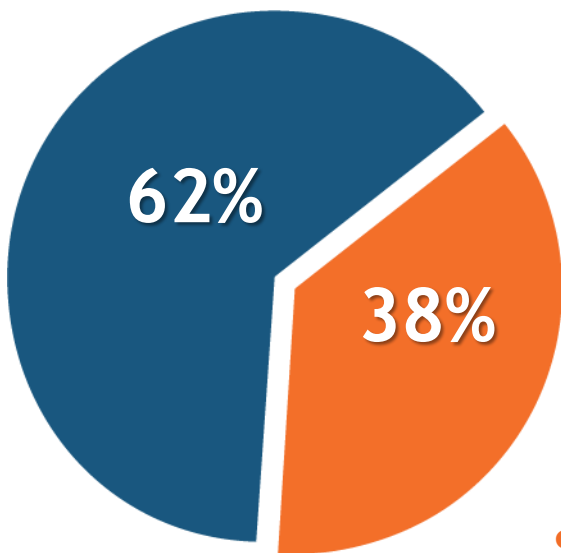
FY 21 Planning Allocation

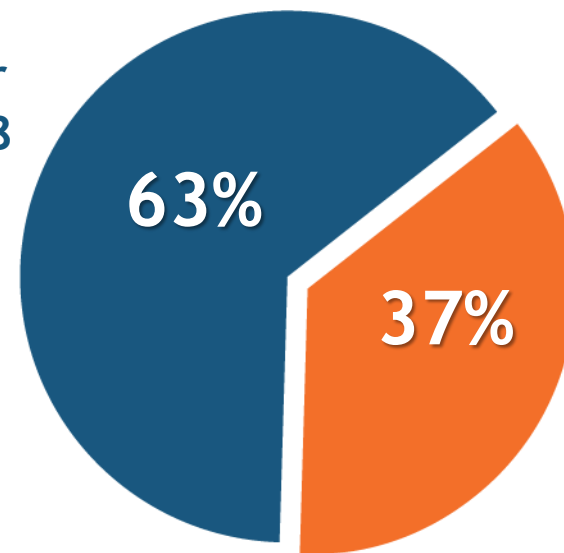

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Federal Coronavirus Funding to ARC

- **Families First: \$1,920,863**
 - Nutrition Services

- **CARES Act: \$6,451,606**
 - Nutrition Services, Caregiver, and Supportive Services funding

- **Consolidated Appropriations Act anticipated award: \$1,355,107**
 - Nutrition Services



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Area Plan/Funding Request Timeline

- **January 27, 2021-** ACA Committee recommended approval
- **February 10, 2021-** Governance Committee review to approve Board Resolution authorizing ARC to submit
- **By March 1, 2021** - If approved, ARC submits FY22 update and funding request to the Georgia Division of Aging Services.
