**V. 2016 Metro Atlanta Speaks Survey:
Summary Findings and New Display Analysis Tool**

The ARC Research & Analytics division, with the assistance of the Burruss Institute at Kennesaw State University, conducted the fourth Metro Atlanta Speaks survey this past July and August. Most of you have heard the "headline" results-- either at late October's State of the Region Breakfast or in the news media. Some of you have even taken a short version of this year's survey, on Survey Monkey. This presentation will take a deeper dive into the regional and county-level "topline" results for selected questions, compared to Board results for those questions. The presentation will intersperse result findings with demonstration of the MAS webpage, which now hosts a new tool developed to make custom "crosstab" results more accessible than ever before.
