


## Industry Decline

Qualifies within the “industry declining” category if employed by an establishment within an industry projected to lose jobs within the Local Workforce Development Area (LWDA) as presented in the report found here:

3. In middle of page, next to “All Industries” click the drop-down menu to select your LWDA.



**INDUSTRY OUTLOOKS**

Long-term Industry Outlook is compiled every other year and is a ten-year industry forecast. The current long-term outlook for Georgia is projected from the year 2020 to 2030 and Local Workforce Development Areas (LWDAs) are projected from 2018 to 2028. Short-term Industry Outlooks are compiled every year and are a two-year industry forecast. The current short-term outlook for Georgia is projected from 2022 to 2024 and short-term projections for Local Workforce Development Areas (LWDAs) are not produced. Due to confidentiality rules, some industry data are not available.

Note: Employment projections are rounded to the nearest ten; percentages of growth are based on unrounded figures.


