




2021 LCI Transportation Call for Projects

- Due to sizable balance of unobligated funds in FY22 (approx. \$11M), need emerged to open applications ahead of the TIP Solicitation
- To expedite process, 2021 LCI Solicitation limited to:
 - PE phases only
 - FY22 funds only
 - 1 application per LCI Area
 - Projects <u>exempt</u> from air quality conformity analysis
- 21 Applications received, 20 eligible
- 17 projects, \$10.5 Million awarded





BASIC LCI APPLICATION INFORMATION

- Reimbursable grant program.
 - ARC pays up to 80% of the study amount
- Applicant must be a CID, local government, or transit agency
- Award up to \$1.8 Million
- Must be able to complete work by October 2025
- Needs to have a multi-modal transportation nexus



What is a Tactical LCI Study



- Your LCI Plan recommended a trail or trail crossing but you need more information to determine if it is feasible
- A roundabout was recommended but before going forward you want to get more public feedback and better construction and right of way costs
- A recommendation was made to develop to update zoning and design guidelines
- You have a large LCI area but are looking for a detail development and transportation recommendations for a specific site or area
- These can be within a Catalytic LCI Study

What is a Catalytic LCI Study



- You are looking to develop your community's first LCI Plan or an update to your LCI Plan
- You must examine connections between land use and transportation
- Develop recommendations for economic development and housing
- Identify and/or write new zoning and design guidelines for implementation.
- Develop a 100 Day Action Plan, 5 Year Work Program and long-term work program

- Creative Placemaking
- Affordable/Diverse Housing
- Climate Resiliency
- Smart City Technology

2023 LCI Program Changes





PROGRAM GOALS:

- Implement the Atlanta Region's Plan at the local level
- Advance socially equitable planning processes & outcomes
- Promote community resiliency to safeguard against future shocks & stressors
- Foster comprehensive, inclusive, & meaningful community engagement

WHAT DO WE MEAN BY EQUITY & RESILIENCY?



SOCIAL EQUITY:

The just & fair inclusion into society in which all can participate, prosper, & reach their full potential. Equitable policies & programs address the harm from past planning outcomes & eliminate present & future harm to people of color, minority communities, seniors, disabled-persons, the LGBTQ community, etc.¹

COMMUNITY RESILIENCY:

The capacity for individuals, communities, institutions, businesses, & systems to survive, adapt, & grow no matter what kinds of chronic stresses & acute shocks they experience.²

COMMUNITY BASED ORGANIZATIONS:

A CBO is an organization with a mission to improve the environmental, economic, social, cultural &/or quality of life conditions of a common community of interest.


The term "organization" should be broadly interpreted & can encompass groups with formal legal status & unregistered groups, such as block clubs, or other groups that may not have a legal designation yet are still organized to work on collective efforts to benefit their community.¹


