




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Federal Shutdown

*as of 10/27, subject to change

- Federal fiscal year ended September 30
- With no new spending bill or CR, lapse in appropriations began October 1
- The state and federal governments have continued reimbursements for ARC services
 - Most ARC transportation programs are funded in advance by IIJA
 - ▶ Incl. Research, Mobility Services, and some Community Development & Natural Resources
 - ARC's aging services are funded by mix of mandatory & discretionary funding
 - UASI and Workforce funds are discretionary
 - ARC is in close communication with state and federal governments and will provide notice of changes

Budget 2025

Expense rate as of August 2025 (53%) is below the 2024 level (58%) for a variety of factors including:

- Delays in the contracting process
- Reimbursement delays, prompting pauses or slowdowns in active contracts
- Uncertainty regarding the authority to implement existing awards
- Rescission of previously awarded funding

Fiscal Position

 Cash position remains strong with over two (2) months of cash on hand to cover expenditures







Operational Snapshot

Healthy, Safe, Livable Communities

- The Transportation Planning Department produced innovative options for vulnerable populations using mobility services
- Mobility Services' Georgia Commute Schools Bike Bus has grown to six active school partners and now transport as many as 50+ students weekly through parent-organized efforts

Competitive Economy

- Technical College System of Georgia awarded the Atlanta Regional Commission \$500,000 for the State Apprenticeship Expansion Grant
- Metro Atlanta Speaks 2025 survey results finalized, new, modern dashboard complete

Operational Efficiency

- New WorkSource Atlanta Regional career centers opened in Gwinnett, Douglas, Henry, and Cherokee counties
- Aging &Independence Services working with the State
 Division of Aging Services on status of federal grant funds

Engaged Stakeholders

- Workforce closed out Program Year 24 activities that included 41,000+ interactions with job seekers and 87% of program graduates finding employment
- The South Metro Trails Elected Officials Network held inaugural meeting October 29
- Biketober was a huge success
- The Regional Housing Strategy kicked off on October 9
- The Regional Leadership Institute graduated 49 participants on October 8
- The 2025 Housing Leadership Academy held its final session on October 2

Strategic Investments

- The airport community, in collaboration with the Atlanta Regional Commission's Mobility Services, launched Shift on Demand, a vanpool service for employees living within the area
- The Urban Area Security Initiative provided 20 specialty vehicles totaling \$1.8 million
