

## ATLANTA REGIONAL WORKFORCE BOARD INSTRUCTION 15-07

**DATE: July 20, 2015** 

SUBJECT: Adult Eligibility for WIOA Career and Training Services

Revised WIOA Definition of the term "low-income individual"

Adults are individuals age 18 and older. Adults can be WIOA eligible as individuals

- (1) Who are unemployed at the time of application
- (2) Who are <u>underemployed</u> at the time of application. This includes:
  - a. SNAP in last six months
  - b. TANF
  - c. An individual whose family meets adult low income guidelines on the attached Income Guideline Chart.
  - d. Individuals with a disability whose own income meets guidelines on the attached Income Guideline Chart, but who is a member of a family whose income does not meet this requirement.

Individuals who are underemployed and meet the definition of a "low-income individual" may receive career and training services under the Adult program per WIOA and ARWDB Policies and Procedures.

Employed earning a wage of \$10.10 per hour is no longer accepted for Adult eligibility.

**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this instruction is to disseminate WIOA Adult Eligibility Guidelines and definition of term "low income individual."

Eligibility for Youth Services continues to be based on 70% of the Lower Living Standard Income Level or 2015 poverty guidelines, whichever is higher.

Income for the last six months will be used to calculate an annualized income for Adult eligibility.

**BACKGROUND**: WIA guidelines for service to underemployed individuals are replaced by WIOA guidelines which include definition of the term "low income individual" for purposes of Adult WIOA eligibility for services.

POLICIES: New guidelines replace old guidelines.

## **ACTION REQUIRED:**

- a. All one-stop and youth program staff must be familiar with the revised guidelines for youth service and Adult career and training services.
- b. For Adults whose eligibility is determined by income guidelines, all one-stop program staff must record income sources and amounts on VOS.
- c. Youth program staff must record income sources and amounts on VOS for eligibility purposes.
- d. All involved staff must read, sign and date the attached signature form.
- e. The Instruction and form should be placed in the Instruction section of ARWDB Policies and Procedures.

## Program Years 2014 and 2015 Six Month Income Guidelines for WIA Low Income Level Figures Effective April 20, 2015

During periods of limited funding for ADULT SERVICES (at this time there is NOT limited funding), priority of service for WIA adult services will be based on family income (100% of 2015 Lower Living Standard Income Level for metropolitan Atlanta) as indicated on the chart below. Income for the last six months will be used to calculate an annualized income for eligibility purposes.

Note: Adult and Youth figures have been adjusted as of April 20, 2015 and are effective April 20, 2015 for WIA eligibility determination purposes.

Eligibility for regular WIA YOUTH SERVICES will be based on 70% of the Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) or 2015 poverty guidelines, whichever is higher, as listed in the chart below. Income for the last six months (6 months prior to WIA application) will be used to calculate an annualized income for eligibility purposes.
