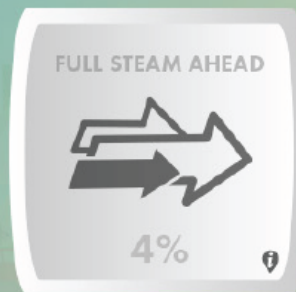
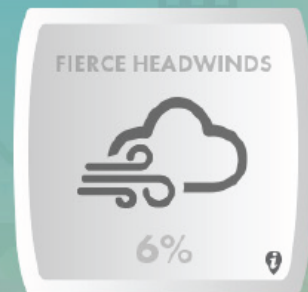
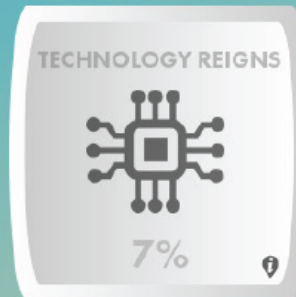


Drivers of Change

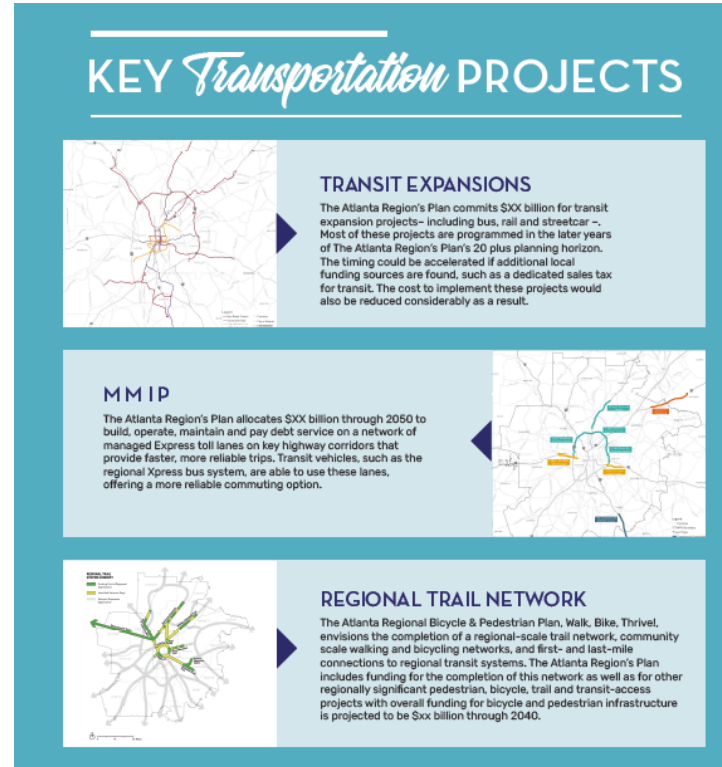
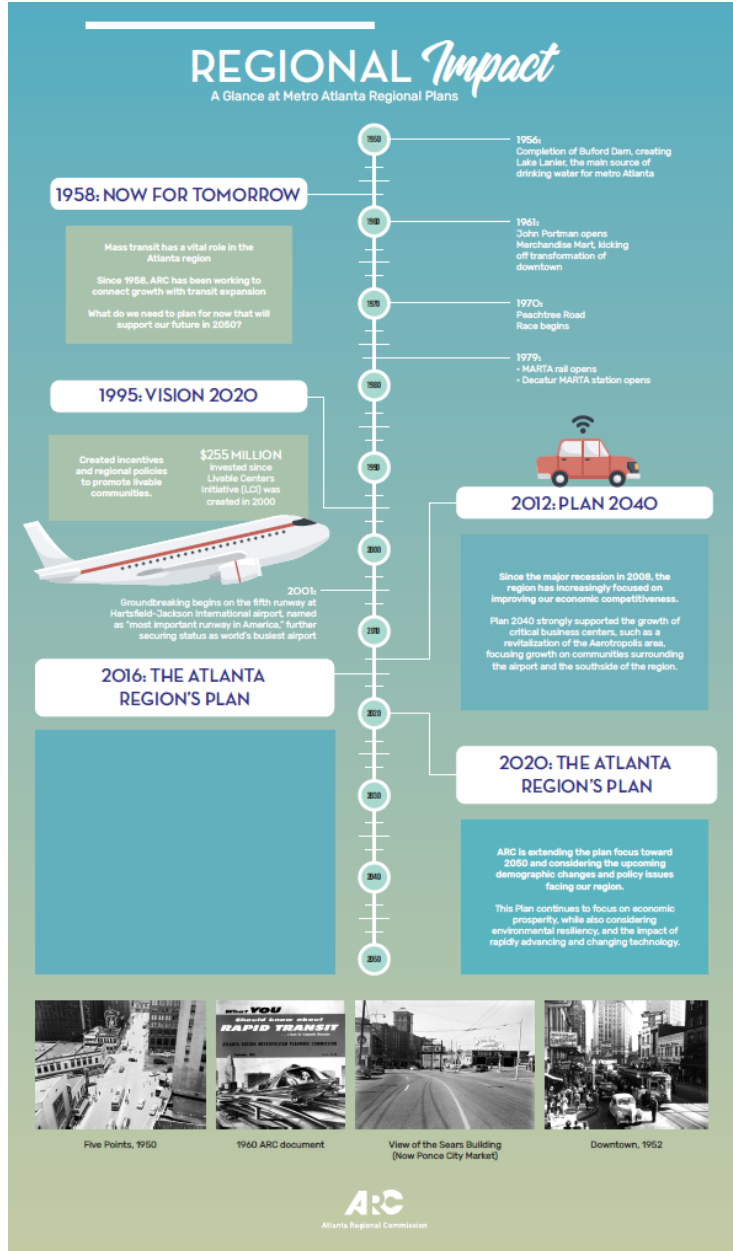

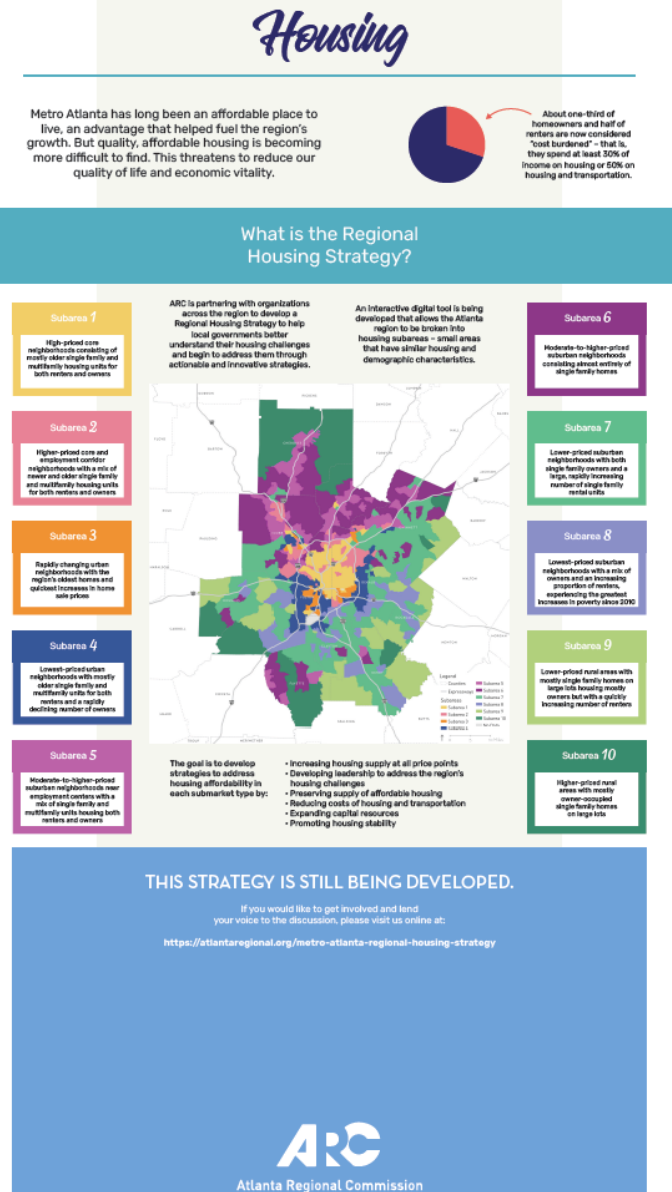
DASH
