As part of the 2016 work program, staff will explore refinement of TIP project selection, prioritization criteria, and evaluation methodology. Major reasons for updating the policy include the Transportation Funding Act of 2015 (HB 170) and federal transportation reauthorization (FAST Act).

The discussion will include:

- Which types of projects are best for certain federal funding programs?
- How should policies of the Atlanta Region's Plan influence project selection and prioritization?
- Should we maintain the existing program areas, and should there be corresponding funding levels or target areas for each area?
- *Should there be any restrictions on federal eligibility?*
- Could there be different local match requirements, based on the program areas?
- Should there continue to be an emphasis on regional significance? How should that be defined?
